SERMON NOTES

King of Kings

Our Gospel reading for today tells of Christ's kingship and confrontation!

There was Pilate – the governor at one side, and on the other, there was Jesus the King. Pilate, for all that his reputation said about him, was a somewhat troubled judge. He was being used. Earlier that morning while he had been resting in his palace, Pilate was interrupted by the Jewish leaders. However, to get them off his back, he summoned Jesus, no doubt hoping that this would calm the situation.



Why do people not like you? Throughout all this, Jesus remained calm. Some scholars have suggested that this is further evidence of Christ's independence that characterised his movement towards Jerusalem and to the cross. "I speak the truth," this is my purpose says Jesus. This had been his

calling from the beginning of his ministry.

This is the nature of the truth – those who are true, understand. It is also the spiritual reality, spiritual power, and spiritual sovereignty of his rule. Christ the King is the message that leads us into our Communion and Advent season
