SERMON NOTES

When Temptation Comes

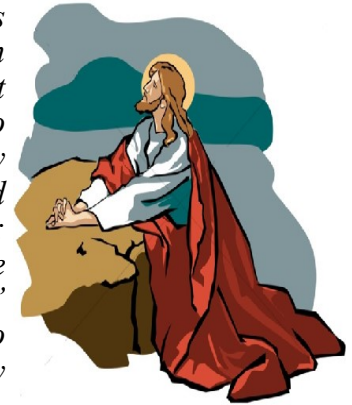
In our Gospel Jesus is brought face to face with the nature of his purpose as the Messiah. The issue facing Jesus was unique, but here too we can relate to him as we can also be tempted.

1. The first temptation was bound up with material success. But Jesus wasn't going to win his mission by bribery and quoted Deuteronomy 8:3: "...man does not live on bread alone." Jesus wasn't going to win his mission by bribery.

2. The second temptation turns from economic to political concerns. All the kingdoms of the world were laid out before him but again, Jesus could not compromise with evil to fulfil his God-given mission of love.

3. The third temptation turned Jesus' attention upon the conviction of God's supporting presence that was made so real in his baptism experience. So, for the third time, Jesus would not tempt the Lord his God.

This morning as we have reflected on the route by which the temptations came to Jesus, I hope that we can understand better our own temptations.
