Jesus was once invited to dinner held in the home of an influential Pharisee. When he arrived he watched with amusement as some of the guests, convinced of their own his status and importance, seated themselves in the places of honour. Perhaps the obvious beginning is the obvious one that guests should wait to be seated.

At first glance, this parable appears to be nothing more than a lesson in etiquette for dinner partygoers, but, Jesus was sent to redeem the world, not to teach it social graces and etiquette. To get the real meaning of this parable, we have to go deeper still and understand that it is God who puts people in their place. As is true of all Jesus' parables, this one has to do with God, the kingdom of God, and our relationship with him.

God is the host. This is his party and God is the one who puts people in their place. The lesson of this parable is that we do not humble or exalt ourselves. Only God can do that.
