When Jesus took bread in his hands and said to his disciples: "This is my body," and took the cup and said, "This is my blood," he meant that they were not literally these, but symbols.

Symbols are more common in our daily life than we perhaps realise. In our Old Testament reading, the Prophet Jeremiah used the potter's clay as a symbol when he said: "Like clay in the hand of the potter, so are you in my hand." Great areas of thought and feeling can be focussed at a single point by a symbol. The cross, for instance, is a symbol. Let it stand silent before us without a word being spoken; and it preached to every heart.

Today, it is not the bread and not the wine that can do anything for us. They are symbols, but they symbolise the Lord Jesus. He is the Bread of Life - its staff and its strength, its daily necessity, without which we cannot live.


PRAYER: Lord, open our eyes and our minds as you did with your disciples - that we might know you as the true Redeemer and Bread of Life...
